The treasure is in one of the towns, or perhaps in all of them. We've left clues to help you to find it. Remember, all the clues and hints are in the Geocaching app. Turn on your GPS and begin the search!

Finally, the town of Barbastro falls! Al Muqtadir and his followers thought we would never take it back. Us! A handful of mountain folk, without the riches of Denia or Valencia - yet we have snatched it back from you.

From my brother-in-law the Count of Urgell to the Bishop of Vic, the Baron of Lower Normandy, the Count of Poitiers and the Duke of Aquitaine. All Christians against the Muslims. THE SMILE OF THE WIND

One of the first things that attract your attention when you get to Alquézar is its location - At the top of the cliff, with long slopes and divided by a river. Do you know what river it is? How many letters does it have?

PORTALÓN AND THE HOUSE OF THE DOCTOR

On the wall of the doctor's house, you will see the name of the street. It is dedicated to one of the most famous inhabitants of Alquézar: Pedro Arnal Cavero. Do you know what he did? Count the letters of his profession.



RAFAEL AYERBE SQUARE

Alquézar has been Muslim, Christian and also something magical. When you walk through the square, you will see amulets hanging on the lintels - things like wild boar feet or dried plants. They are there to ward off evil spirits and attract fertility to the lands and the farm animals.

How many boar's feet are there? That will be your clue.



COLLEGIATE CHURCH OF SANTA María la Mayor

In the cloister of the College, at the top of one of the column "capitals", you will see a female dancer. We only ask you for the number of letters in her name. It is easy. This dancer is biblical, and if you look, they are giving her a head on a silver platter.



BARRANCO DE LA FUENTE

When the monumental fountain was built, a cross was engraved on the stone. They hoped it would protect the water from poisoning, tainting and drought. You will also see a shield. It has the year of construction on it. Add up the numbers until there is only one digit left. Save the clue.

WHERE IS THE TREASURE?

Remember that the results of the clues are numeric keys that must be in the same sequence as the route that we give here. When you unlock it, you will find the treasure.



BRIDGE OF VILLACANTAL

The Romans were great builders, so much so that many bridges built centuries later are also said to be Roman. This is the case of this bridge at Villacantal that is from the XVI century, although "popular opinion" says that the Romans built it. How many eyes does the bridge have?
